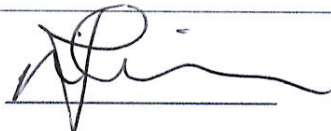


Health, Safety & Keeping it real

Be Practicable Health and Safety policies have to be based common sense. If something doesn't work, we find a better solution and make it happen. We will support our trained crew if a critical decision has to be made to keep everyone safe.	Communicate We put effort into making sure all our team are informed and understand this policy, and any other health and safety documentation. We consult and communicate in an honest and upfront manner with all our team.
Leave no trace Our oceans and coastlines are under constant pressure from human activities. Our privilege to see what we see in our travels is matched by our commitment to leave no trace of our presence ensuring the safety of that place and its inhabitants.	Manage Risks Aim to eliminate work related injuries by identifying and controlling workplace hazards.
Be Fit for Work All our crew, at sea, on shore or on the phone, are mentally or physically fit for their role. We have a zero tolerance for alcohol and drug use and we proactive manage the potential for fatigue. Everyone needs to be well and of good well being to do their role in the safest and best way.	Safety is everyone's business For this reason, every person is responsible for their own safety. Due to the nature of our activities, we will ensure everyone is aware of this expectation. If we all follow instruction, communicate and participate as directed, good things will happen.
